





The trees of the Pinery are one of our community's most defining and beloved features. Their presence lends natural beauty and character to our neighborhoods. But when trees die, they stop being assets—and can quickly become hazards.

The Dangers of Dead Trees

Dead trees aren't just eyesores. They can threaten the very things we care about most: our homes, our neighborhoods, our families, and ourselves. There are many hazards that dead trees can pose:

- Structural instability from decomposition makes trunks and limbs prone to falling, which could damage homes, vehicles, or block roads.
- Pest infestations can spread from dead wood to healthy trees
 and even into homes.
- Tree illnesses may infect nearby vegetation.
- Wildfire risk rises dramatically in dry conditions. They can easily ignite in the right conditions – quickly spreading to other trees and homes.
- Property values can suffer when dead trees litter the landscape.

GOOD NEWS: CHIPPER DAYS IS COMING

Our annual Chipper Days event is just around the corner—and it's the perfect time to address brush and some of those lingering dead trees in your yard.

Pinery HOA residents can take advantage of convenient curbside chipping services. If you're pruning, limbing, or removing brush this fall, this is a great opportunity to have it hauled away with minimal effort.

Smaller trees—typically under 12" in diameter—qualify for this event.

See addresses on this page and next for YOUR PICK-UP DAY.

Put items out with your regular trash by 6 a.m.

1 Large item only!

5 additional bags of yard debris allowed (each less than 40 lbs.) and/or branches cut down to less than 4 feet, bundled and tied. Items must be able to be easily carried, handled and tossed.

Acceptable items: Couches, loveseats, recliners, mattresses, box springs (all sizes), bed frames, tables, chairs, BBQ grills, empty lawnmowers

Unacceptable items:

- no electric corded items, washers, dryers, ranges, microwaves
- No electronic waste such as computers, printers or monitors
- No hazardous waste, construction debris, car parts, hot tubs, basketball hoops, dirt, rock, concrete, water heaters

Important Notice Regarding Betts Lake Access

From the Board of Reata South Metropolitan District

Dear Pinery Residents,

We hope this letter finds you well. As representatives of the Reata South Metropolitan District Board of Directors we are writing to clarify the status of Betts Lake within our community.

Betts Lake is a private amenity, exclusively reserved for the use of Colorado Golf Club (CGC) members and residents. We ask for your understanding and cooperation in respecting this policy. CGC residents who live around the lake experienced incidents of trespassing on private lots, loud music, littering and more as it relates to activity around the lake. Our security guards have increased patrols in the lake area to notify non-residents that Betts Lake is not open to the general public for fishing, swimming, boating, or any other recreational activities.

To help preserve the health and balance of this unique ecosystem, as well as to maintain the operational needs of the golf club, access restrictions are strictly enforced. We kindly request that all area residents refrain from entering the lake area or utilizing it for any recreational purpose unless you are a CGC member or resident with authorized access.

Thank you for your attention to this matter and for helping us protect the integrity of Betts Lake for the benefit of our community and local wildlife.

ife can change in a moment - make sure you are connected to the CodeRED emergency notification system in Douglas County! The system, CodeRED, is a high-speed telephone emergency notification service allowing public safety agencies the ability to deliver pre-recorded information to targeted areas within the county.

Douglas County's public safety agencies encourage everyone to register their contact information in the CodeRED system (reverse 911). Registration is not automatic, but it may be critical to your safety and that of your family.



2025 Pinery Fishing Derby
